## 439 LAB REPORT EDITING CHECKLIST April 2008

- Did you run Spell/Grammar Check tools to catch obvious typographical, spelling and grammar errors: read carefully, do not arbitrarily accept all proposed changes!
- Do you use commas? After opening introductory phrases, in lists, at beginning and end of parenthetical phrases in middle of sentences, e.g. Look at semi-colons: are phrases fore and aft of semi-colon independent (= full sentences)?
- 3. Format: Are all lab partners noted on your cover page, and is your name clearly indicated? Is each section of lab report labeled?
- 4. Tables/graphs: embedded on page where those results are discussed? Did you number your Figures/Tables and give each a title? Are all acronyms defined in a caption (figures) or footnote to the table? Is your y-axis tall enough to effectively illustrate variations in your y-values?
- After at least 30 minutes pause, did you re-read for gaps in logical flow of your writing? For typo's and grammar errors? {NEW as of APRIL} For using active and not passive voice? Avoid excessive use of "weak verbs": variations on be/do/make.
- 6. Citation check:

a. Do you have at least 3 citations, including at least one "primary" reference (data-based research report in a print journal)?

b. Do all embedded citations in your text follow format in
Citation Guidelines (author(s), year of pub)? Does every citation
have a corresponding entry in your Reference List?

c. Does formatting of listed references in your reference list follow format in Citation Guidelines? Is every listed reference cited within the report?
